**Title: Recreation Ground Mound** 

## **Purpose of Report**

For members to consider authorising Officers to research and find a suitable solution to cover the bare area of the mound.

## Recommendation:

Members resolve to recommend to Full Council to delegate officers to establish and implement a solution to the bare ground on the mound.

## Report:

- The refurbishment of the recreation ground play park included a mound for the installation of a slide. Two pull up ropes were also installed as an alternative way for children to get to the top of the mound.
- 2. Now that the slide has been in use since April 2021, the grass has been continually worn away, leaving a large area of bare earth.
- 3. On a positive note, it's fantastic that the children enjoy using the facility so often, however, it leaves the mound looking unsightly. It also gets muddy if there's a shower or worse, rain.
- 4. Having visited other play parks, the bare earth problem would appear to be a common occurrence with mounds that have slides.
- 5. There are still funds available from the refurbishment budget. The final invoices for the youth shelter and the project manager have been paid. This has left a balance of £5,821.29 in Earmarked Reserves for the refurbishment of the play park.
- 6. Possible solutions include a rubber style surface such as the one already under the slide or a climbing wall similar to the one already in West Crescent play park. There may be other possibilities that officers could explore.
- 7. Researched solutions for this issue would be in consultation with both the Chair and Vice Chair of Open Spaces before any action would be taken by Officers.
- 8. Members may resolve to recommend to Full Council to delegate Officers to seek a suitable solution to solve this problem or Members may have another viewpoint on this matter.
