Discussions followed regarding future uses of the North Street offices and Cemetery Lodge, and a working group had been set up to discuss options.

Town Clerk and Cllr Shepherd received a letter from the Neighbourhood Plan Inspector who had issued 27 points to be answered – ECA and the Neighbourhood Plan Development Group to discuss and respond. Cllr Shepherd advised all Councillors that they should attend the meeting. The deadline for responses is 18th October 2022. Cllr James asked if ECA could be audited after this process.

Town Clerk discussed the support received from MTIG including the Welcome Back Funding which Ilminster Town had received. MTIG is finishing in November 2022. Cllr Keitch asked if we could send a Thank you letter for their support.

2022-0103-TC Use of the Market House

Members discussed the situation for clarity. The Market House should be used as Ilminster is a market town, and times have changed and the council should encourage use of it. Charities and not for profit organisations should still be given priority on Saturdays.
