Title: Resources Finance Report

Purpose of Report

To report the income and expenditure figures that have been reconciled from 1st April 2021 to 30th November 2021.

Recommendation:

Report:

1. Income - Resources

- a. Since the last report ending 31st July 2021, the income for the following four months has included the second half of the precept £167,622.50, a Neighbourhood Plan Grant of £7,150.00, and the Community Grant from Somerset County Council of £1,010.00 for a Covid Recovery event in May next year. The last part of a bequest of £19,381.79 was also received for the recreational facilities of Ilminster, and donations towards the Christmas Lights of £4950.50.
- b. As the host provider, we have now received training course fees from Chard Town Council for £192 which was a third of the total cost for one employee who took part in the tractor training in September.
- c. Total income at the end of November £402,298.83.

2. Expenditure – Resources

- a. There have been various costs associated with the purchase of the Magistrates Court such as insurance, utilities etc. under budget headings 354 and 358.
- b. Budget heading 356/1, the Town Council awarded £5,112.00 in grants. £5,000 to Somerset County Council for the library service and £112.00 to Sunflowers of Somerset.
- c. The external auditor fees under budget heading 365 were £1,300.00 for the 2020-2021 audit.
- d. A few Councillors undertook online training to improve their knowledge and skills in being a councillor under budget heading 368 of £340.00.
- e. Expenditure of £6,012.66 arose for Christmas Lights under budget heading 374, however this is balanced out by the year end with income from donations.
- f. Subscription costs for Somerset Association of Local Councils and for Edge IT systems amounted to £2,159.28 under budget heading 375.
- g. Budget heading 395 includes the purchase and installation costs of the slide, the surfacing and the boulders on the recreation ground which came to £20,943.70. This also included the post installation inspection, heras fencing and the surfacing of the tunnel as well. The youth shelter is expected to be installed in February/March 2022.

h. Total expenditure at the end of November £415,536.04
