Title: Financial Monitoring Report

Purpose of Report

To report the income and expenditure figures from 1 April 2023 to 31 December 2023.

Recommendation:

Members to note the finance report.

Report:

- The income and expenditure for Open Spaces and the cemetery are found on Appendix 8A. Details of income and expenditure in November and December are explained below.
- Income of £110.00 was received from the metal recycling centre. The lease payment for the Archie Gooch Pavilion £568.75 was received. For Open Spaces, the total income received from 1 November to 31 December 2023 was £678.75.
- 3. Cemetery fees received are in line with expected budgeted income of £915.00.
- 4. A pair of safety rubber boots were purchased for the Town Clerk £17.95 to enable him to make site visits. The two direct debits for electricity to the Wardens Building and the public conveniences totalled £144.78. Fuel for the grounds vehicles and equipment cost £396.01. Purchase of various materials including nuts and bolts, batteries, postcrete for benches, paint and paint brushes, discs and oil cost £504.97.
- The winter plants for the planters and troughs from Mousehole Nurseries cost £768.07. The hire of a jet pressure washer used for cleaning paths in the cemetery and churchyard cost £254.08. The ATV required two new front tyres fitted at a cost of £44.00.
- 6. CCTV survey of the disabled toilet at the recreation ground and a drainage survey for Cemetery Lodge and the cemetery cost **£395.00**.
- 7. Open Spaces expenditure during November and December was £2,806.53.
- 8. The only expenditure on the cemetery was £1,950.00 for scanning the 15 burial books which can now be sent to Somerset Heritage Centre.
- 9. Total expenditure from 1 April to 31 December was £53,846.69, however, £28,236.43 of the expenditure was paid from Earmarked Reserves. Income received totals £13,417.41.
