I note from the town council's submission to the Inspector for the resumed Local Plan that late evidence has been discovered of great crested newts in a pond on the County Council owned land at Coldharbour Farm.

From the evidence it states that a newt was first found by the farmer of Coldharbour Farm, Christina Miller, and provides the series of emails between her neighbour Mr Andrew Warde of Coldharbour Farmhouse and Somerset Trust officials.
